## Developing a technology strategy for schools: key questions



1 What communication policies do you have in place? Are parents, staff and pupils aware of them?

You can make it clear to parents that having strict communication policies does not mean you're unwilling to talk to them but at an appropriate place and time.

When was the last time you shared communication expectations with the school community? Try to share your communication expectations with the school community at the beginning of the academic year. This sets a clear boundary.

3 What is your email protocol?

Having guidance on how you communicate with colleagues internally can make a massive difference.

4 What about other communication platforms?

WhatsApp groups can add additional pressure to feel like you must be 'switched on' at all hours. Do you have a specific policy in place around this type of communication?

What should staff do if they feel harassed by parents, students or colleagues? Make it clear in your strategy who they can turn to for support and the steps they should follow.

6 How often will you review this strategy?

How often do you plan on reviewing this document and ensuring it is still fit for purpose? We suggest you revisit this strategy at least once every academic year.



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
